A family is a group of people who live together. They share the housework and take care of one another. Three types of family are nuclear family, single-parent family and extended family. A nuclear family is made up of father, mother and one or more children living together. A single-parent family is one where the mother or the father is caring for the children in the family. Extended family means father, mother, children, grandparents, uncles, aunts, cousins, nieces, and nephews. Poor people often have larger families than middle class and upper class people. And people in underdeveloped countries have more children than people in developed countries. More and more experts in population growth see the strong relationship between family size and economic development. People with a lot of money have fewer children. They know that having more children might be hard and cause them to be a little poorer, but they also know that having more children will actually help them survive.
